NATIONAL WORKSHOP ON AGROFORESTRY RESEARCH (3-5 APRIL, 1989)

A National Workshop on Agro-forestry Research was held with the assistance of USAID-MART Project and Government of Pakistan at Punjab Forestry Research Institute, Faisalabad, on 3-5 April, 1989. The objectives were to highlight research needs and priorities in the field of agro-forestry, assessing on-going agro-forestry / farming systems research, identify research gaps and resources in terms of equipment and expertise, and streamline mechanisms for collaboration.
